Hello, I'm Masanori Namba from Jissen Women's University in Tokyo, Japan. I feel so happy and much honored to be here.

Our university has more than 120 years of history, and our motto has remained the same since its beginning: "When women change society, they change the world." I think this message is more important than ever, because the number of women's universities in Japan is decreasing. If nothing changes, we won't survive in the future.

That's why when we learned about Estonia, particularly how the country has developed since restoring independence, and became known for its digital innovation and entrepreneurship, we strongly felt that new possibilities can be found here.
